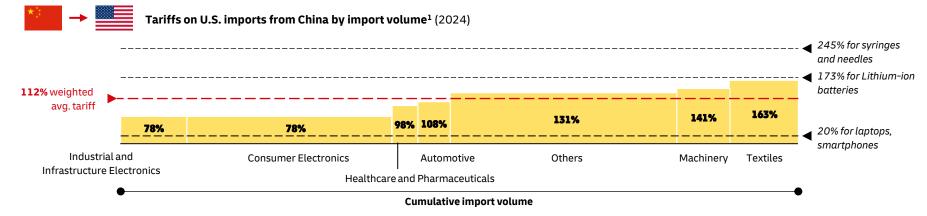

CURRENT STATUS OF THE TARIFF SITUATION

U.S. tariffs on Chinese imports consist of four key components:

- 1. Product-specific base tariffs established prior to 2025 (Section 301, HS-code),
- 2. 20% "fentanyl" tariff imposed in response to the flow of fentanyl into the U.S. (under IEEPA),
- 3. 125% "reciprocal tariff" aimed at rebalancing the bilateral trade relationship (IEEPA), and
- 4. additional product-specific exemptions (e.g., smartphones)

De-minimis removal for imported goods that are valued at or under 800 USD are now also subject to applicable duties: Option 1: 120% ad valorem duty rate or Option 2: 200 USD duty per postal item
