





Strong and steady growth in Indian air and ocean trade predicted by DHL Global Trade Barometer

Key findings:

- According to GTB measurements, India continues to have the brightest growth prospects of all seven countries evaluated
- Overall trade in India improves by +2 points to an index value of 84
- Indian air trade remains stable at the high level of 82 points, while ocean trade further increased by +2 points, reaching a value of 85 index points

The Global Trade Barometer measures very high levels of growth for Indian trade. In fact, India scores highest in the overall trade predictions as well as the separate predictions for air and ocean trade, respectively. For all three aspects, a continuous acceleration since November 2017 was measured. Another particularity with respect to India is that all sectors observed make a significant positive contribution to this development. Regarding sectors,

trade in basic and (to a lesser extent) industrial raw materials was of great importance to the development of Indian trade as a whole.

Air trade growth is expected to remain positive (82) and unchanged compared to December, as the outlook for air imports remains strongly positive. Machinery parts, high tech and industrial raw materials trade drive most of the expected Indian air trade growth, especially for air imports into India. All industries show a positive contribution to the air trade index for India.

Ocean trade growth is expected to further improve as the index increases to 85, gaining another +2 points compared to an already very positive outlook in previous months. Basic raw materials trade remains the most important driver for Indian ocean trade, especially for ocean imports to India. All industries show a positive contribution to the ocean trade index of India.

About the DHL Global Trade Barometer:

The DHL Global Trade Barometer an early indicator for the current state and future development of global trade. It is based on import and export data for a number of intermediates and early-cycle commodities that serve as the basis for further industrial production. Sources for the index are aggregated market data from air and containerized ocean freight from seven countries (China, South Korea, Germany, India, Japan, UK, USA), which account for more than 75 percent of world trade. These data are evaluated using artificial intelligence and various statistical methods and compressed to a single index value that represents the weighted average of the current growth and the upcoming two months of trade. The index, which was designed in cooperation with Accenture, is published four times a year by DHL on a global scale as well as for each of the seven countries surveyed.
